**ORDER DENYING PLAINTIFF'S MOTION
FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION**

THIS MATTER comes before the Court pursuant to Plaintiff's Motion for Temporary Injunction (Doc. 11). In this motion, Plaintiff requests the Court enjoin the Defendants from luring him into the State of Colorado by threatening to revoke any bond, issuing any bench warrant or by any other means. A temporary restraining order under Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b) is extraordinary relief requiring a strong showing of likelihood of success on the merits as well as irreparable harm. Plaintiff's motion fails to make any showing of likelihood of success on the merits. Accordingly, the request for a temporary injunction is denied at this time.
